BNCA hosts Two Days State Level SPPU sponsored QIP on Massive Open Online Courses



Day 01 of the workshop

A two day state level seminar was conducted by Dr. BN College of Architecture for Women, Pune on 16th and 17th Feb 2023. 68 participants registered for the programme.

In the inaugural session, Dr. Chetan Sahasrabudhe explained the importance of the seminar under NEP 2020 and regarding the recent circular by UGC and SPPU about implementation of 20% curriculum with the help of MOOCs.

The second session was delivered by Dr. Shashank Sonavne, Professor, dept of Library and Inf. Sc. of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University (BAMU), Aurangabad. He talked about the concept and history of MOOCs as well as the international efforts taken worldwide to develop and use MOOCs. He also spoke about Coursera, Edex and such platforms.

The third session was delivered by Dr. Vandana Shelar, Head of Dept of LIS and Librarian of Abasaheb Garware College, Pune. She explained the importance of MOOCs, its usage and adaptability in current curriculum development.

Post Lunch, the fourth session was conducted by Prof. Umesh Chavan to explain the way technology is being used in developing MOOCs. He described the open source softwares and competent hardware required to shoot MOOCs like camera, mobile etc.

Day one of the seminar concluded with the fifth session conducted by certified Google Trainer Mr. Nikhil Kulkarni of Aaadyansh.in. He illustrated all google tools which are helpful to develop MOOCs, websites, classroom etc.

Day two of the seminar began with the lecture by Dr. Chhaya Gosavi, Professor at Cummins College of Engineering Pune, her topic being "course design in MOOCs" with content planning. She explained the IIT initiatives. The second session was about SWAYAM and NPTEL MOOCs and Google sites by Prof. Dr. Meenal Oak, Librarian at IMCC. She explained about the Indian National effort on MOOCs that is SWAYAM and its advantages.

After the session a study visit was organized to MKSSS School of Media Art (SMART) in the campus. Participants were given a demo of a shoot with professional cameras and few editing techniques.

The last session of day two was conducted by Dr. Sadanand Bansode, Head of Dept of LIS, SPPU, Pune. He took the overview of MOOCs and explained the role of the Library Science professional in the development and handling of MOOCs.

The two day seminar ended with valedictory function and feedback session from the participants and thanks giving by the coordinators.

Dr Talegaonkar's session titled 'India in Virginia' was organized by INTACH and BNCA Center for Cultural Arts in February. Dr. Talegaonkar is the multi cultural advisor and curator of Virginia Museum of Fine Arts. (VMFA)

He said that a National Museum should ideally cater to all age groups and should be a joyful attraction to all and that special efforts and positive support is required from all levels of society.

Since 1937, this museum has collected over 35000 members and over 36000 rare artefacts from the donations of art collectors from India, Tibet, China and South Africa. Rare artefacts, sculptures, paintings and Archaelogical samples from the last 1500 years are in the museum, making it a living encyclopedia of various religions, sects and cultures.

## Edutech session on Ferrocrete by Mr. Nandkumar Jadhav

The 27th Edutech session was held on 22nd February 2023 at 3pm in BNCA Auditorium. The speaker was Mr. Nandkumar Jadhav and he spoke on Ferrocrete Technology.

The session was co-ordinated by Prof. Poorva Kulkarni and Prof. Nilima Dhamal on behalf of BNCA.

Mr, Jadhav explained the technology of constructing in Ferrocrete by showcasing his own house in Satara bulit in ferrocrete with 2 inch thick walls and slab.

He explained to the students how thin ferrocrete walls need to have folds in order to achieve the desired structural stability. This he did through pictures taken during the construction and after the construction to enable students to grasp it in a better way. He had presented this house at the International ferrocement conference in Germany in 2015 and his work was very well appreciated. He also narrated how he came to be India's most sought after expert ferrocrete contractor.

He showcased his work which included ferrocrete interiors, ferrocrete caves and restaurants, entrance canopies, temples, compound walls, all of them being non linear structures. This enabled the students to understand the potential of design opportunities using ferrocrete technology and the varied forms that are possible in ferrocrete.

The fact that he is internationally ac claimed by an award by the American concrete Institute besides being awarded by builders association of India and AESA inspired the students. He has worked on many projects with landscape Architect Jayant Dharap, including his own home which is designed by Dharap Sir.

Prof. Neha Adkar, faculty at M. Arch Landscape had worked on the ferrocrete house at Satara and she narrated her experience in the session.

All these things made the session enriching for the students. Mr. Jadhav gave an important message for the students and that was about preserving human values.

Day 02 was reserved for the visit to the capitol complex, the site for the architectural design project.

Students observed the Secretariat building, the High Court building, and the Assembly building where they came to know about the history and concept of the plaza. Later, they visited the Le Corbusier center and the Chandigarh College of Architecture where they observed the small scale models and replica of the capitol complex. Later they visited the Pierre Jeanerette museum where Le Corbusier had stayed and worked on the city planning.

On the third day, they proceeded to

They took a walk around the Red Fort from outside and later on did some shopping at the famous Chandni chowk followed by a visit to the Gurudwara and Jain temple and snacked on the famous local street food.

Day 04 began with a visit to the Qutub complex with appreciation of the intricate detailing of the Qutb Minar. Next on the list was the famous Lotus temple of Bahai where the students experienced the unique structure, the landscape and water. In the evening they visited Humayan's tomb and admired its architectural magnificience and the unique water channels.

Later they visited India Gate and the Kartavya path(Raj Path).

On Day 05 they visited the Jantar Mantar and stopped by to see the LIC building designed by Charles Correa, from the outside with its beautiful entrance.

They visited Connaught Place and Jan path. The next stop was the India International Centre and India Habitat center. Everybody shopped to their hearts content at Sarojini market in the evening.

On the last day they visited the Agra fort and Fatehpur Sikri in the morning. The Siliguri-Bhutan studio tour was for a duration of 6 days. The students were accompanied by Dr. Shubhada Kamlapurkar, Prof. Suneeta Bapat, Mrs. Shilpa Pathak and Mr. Sandeep Joshi from Wheel of Innovations. Starting the journey on 6th February

2023, the team flew to Bagdogra airport and reached Siliguri at 11.30 am.

They checked into the hotel Signett's Tanya at Siliguri, and after lunch, left to study the site at Siliguri. They

studied the 5.5 km long stretch of NH10 (Champasari road). The site was divided into 8 patches, and groups of 4 to 5 students were allotted one each. The students mapped all the aspects like the Architectural vocabulary, vegetation, topography, built development, and the activities happening there.

On the way back, they visited Vega Circle mall to study the contemporary architectural vocabulary of the city. At the hotel, post dinner, there was a post-visit discussion about the study area, and with the faculty, students mapped and compiled the

On day 2, after breakfast they visited the Salagura Monastery and studied traditional Buddhist religious architecture.

Then they visited the tea estates on the outskirts of Siliguri to see the tea plantations and studied the step-bystep production of tea in the factory. After a quick lunch of traditional Bengali food they visited the 'Biswa Bangla' Shilpi Haat, where they studied the architecture of the Haat, with workshop spaces for the artisans. They also visited the SJDA (Siliguri Jalpaiguri Development Authority), to talk to the chief architect and planner of the city as well as the CEO, where some students interacted with him and presented their ideas. Some other students visited the local Hong Kong market, to study the organic development of the creative economy-based marketplace.

The next day was spent in travelling to Bhutan. On the way, they saw the Coronation Bridge across the Teesta river. The local tour guides Ugyen <u>Tshering and Sonam Doril joined in</u>

After immigration, they had local lunch at Phuentsholing and reached Thimpu around 9.30 pm.

Day 4 was for Thimpu sightseeing. They visited the Giant Buddha statue and learnt about the origins of Bud-

dhism in the country.

Later they visited the government art college - National Institute of Zorig Chusum, and interacted with the students and the Principal there and then visited 'Simply Bhutan', a museum for Bhutanese culture with live demonstrations and cultural displays about daily Bhutanese life.

After a traditional lunch they visited a local Thimpu market to see fresh local produce. Next was the visit to the Monastery and Dzong for the flag ceremony.

On day 5, they left for Paro, and upon reaching there, immediately went to Tiger's Nest After a day of trekking

and visiting the monastery at the top, and quick food at the local café, they reached the hotel in the evening by 6 and visited the local market in Paro around the hotel, and had dinner.

The next day was spent in travelling and they reached the hotel in Siliguri at night.

On day 7, they boarded the flight at 10.15am and reached Pune at 5.15 pm. It was an educational as well as culturally enriching tour, which helped the students grasp a lot about both Siliguri and Bhutan, their Architecture, traditions and local culture.

#### **Odisha National Tour**

The National tour to Odisha, also called Utkala or the land of temples and beaches was accompanied by Dr. Sharvey Dhongde, Prof. Sourabh Marathe, Prof. Surabhi Gadkari, Prof. Neeraja Hingne, Prof. Neha Adkar and Prof. Shruti Ramteerthakar.

On day 01, this group of 45 people reached Bhuvaneshwar late evening. Next morning they headed out to the Lingaraj temple of Lord Shiva, a fine specimen of Kalinga style of Temple architecture.

Later they visited another smaller

After lunch they visited the Krushi Bhavan, a beautiful building with a central courtyard, introducing the indigenous art forms of Odisha like tribal craft depicting agricultural folklore and mythological stories, various fabric patterns, Pattachitra illustrations depicting home-grown ripe paddy crops and using locally available construction materials. The ground floor was a free-flowing public space opening out into a plaza consisting of water fountains and seating areas and becoming an extension of the street.

On day 02 they visited the well maintained and preserved Udayagiri and Khandagiri caves.

Situated on two adjacent hills, they have a number of caves serving as residential blocks for Jain monks during the reign of King Kharavela built during the 1st century BCE. The students explored the inscrip-

tions, motifs, reliefs and scripts.

In the evening on the way to Puri, they visited a unique tribal museum and a state museum. The well curated museums displayed the lifestyle of the tribal people with attention to clothing and draping, ornaments, tools for hunting and fishing, various

skillsets and indigenous artwork. The central courtyard in the Tribal Museum displayed the construction materials and ways to build their dwellings and transportation methods.

The state museum has documented the palm leaf writings across centuries, sculptures and motifs belonging to various temples excavated during various archaeological activities, artwork and fabrics that have originated in Orissa.

They also visited the Chausath Yogini Temple, a unique structure without a shikhara on top, constructed for yoginis who were Goddess Durga's 64 demi-goddess forms to defeat a demon named Raktabeejasura.

They visited Peepli – an artisan's village on the way. The main street had shops displaying artwork, fabrics, authentic cloth lanterns and an array of vivid colors.

The next morning they visited the Jagannath Puri temple, considered as one of the Char Dhams of India, sacred to all Hindus. Lots of legends revolve around the temple's construction, the deities of Krishna, Balarama and Subhadra being sculpted in wood but left incomplete and the temple being visited by great saints throughout history. They took the 1

km walk on the wide road that witnesses the famous Rath Yatra every year.

The evening was dedicated to the 3 hour Chilika lake boat ride. The lake is one of the 2 largest freshwater lakes in Asia and is home to dolphins which the group spotted in abundance!

On the last day they visited the heritage village of Raghurajpur, the birthplace of many art forms. One of them is Pattachitra – cloth-based scroll paintings depicting various mythological stories, deities in vivid forms and daily tribal lifestyle that dates back to almost 5 B.C. Gottipua dance troupes and eventually the Odissi dance form also originated in this small village. Lastly they visited the majestic Sun temple, Konark resembling the chariot of the Sun with wheels below and horses in front.

The intricately designed 24 chakras or wheels show the exact time of the day down to a minute. Also called as the Surya Devalaya, it resembles the Kalinga style of Temple Architecture. Often called as Black Pagoda, it served as a reference point for the European sailors out in the Bay. The Jagannath Temple was referred

to as the White Pagoda.

The next 14 hours were spent on the journey back to Pune.

# Rajasthan 14th-19th Feb 2023

The tour was accompanied by BNCA faculty Prof. Yash Joshi and Amol Hinge. On 14th Feb at dawn, the team reached Pushkar, Rajasthan. Day 1 began by visiting the Brahma Temple at Pushkar. The Brahma Temple, also known as Jagatpita Brahma Mandir is one of the very few existing temples in India dedicated to Lord Brahma. The temple, made of marble and stone slabs, has a distinct red pinnacle or shikhara.

The second half of the first day was spent at the Pushkar Sarovar, the sacred lake of Hindus. Pushkar Lake is surrounded by 52 bathing ghats, where pilgrims throng in large numbers to take a sacred bath. The Maha Aarti at the Pushkar Lake in the evening proved to be a religious spectacle.

On day 2 they left for Jaipur and on the way, visited MAYO College, Ajmer, one of the oldest 'boys-only' Indian public boarding schools. The

British built Mayo for the princes and nobles of India to give an education like that given by Eton College. Being a boarding school, it had various hostel blocks named Jodhpur House, Bikaner House etc. The students visited the museum,

assembly hall, classrooms, and saw the sports facilities of the college. They observed various architectural elements such as columns, arches, defining the unique style of the structure. The tour of the campus was conducted by a member of the institute's faculty.

After reaching Jaipur by noon they visited the Birla Temple, followed by the city tour of old Jaipur where they visited Choti Choppad, Badi Choppad and the famous Hawa Mahal.

On day 3 they visited the Vivekanand Global University to see the Design Campus, where they got a warm wel

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come and a hands-on experience on various studios there like the textile studio, the block painting studio, 3Dprinting, welding and wood cutting. In the second half they visited the Jawar Kala Kendra designed by Charles Correa. They saw the museums, amphitheatre and auditorium, library, arts display rooms, cafeteria, small hostel, and art-studio. The time at Jawahar Kala Kendra was spent exploring and sketching. This was followed by shopping in the old city of Jaipur.
